Bert Thorton, former CEO of Waffle House, had grown the restaurant to almost 2.000 locations at the time of his retirement. His desire was that people who entered a Waffle House would always feel welcomed and know what to expect.

He also wanted to help his employees. Thorton said, "We take people from where they are and give them a chance to rise up within the company." The secret of the company's success? "The people working at Waffle House usually have a sense of humor and like having fun together."

I'm grateful that our church's personality is such that we seek to "keep the main thing the main thing" as it relates to knowing Christ and making him known in our community and world.
