When we first talked to Stan Brock and Remote Area Medical about a clinic at FBC in 2010, they were skeptical about our ability to meet their criteria for a clinic. Rev. Stan Elliott was adamant that the Church could do it and we forged ahead with our first (2011) clinic serving over 1000 patients. Since that time many churches have followed our lead.

RAM has changed and FBC has changed, but the need for the RAM Clinic services has not changed. The cost of our 2011 clinic was less than \$25,000 and in 2024 expenses will be LifeGroups) in the \$40,000 range.


